A SELF-PROFESSED “PRINCESS” MOM WHO PLAYS DRESS UP WITH HER DAUGHTER EVERY DAY SWAPS LIVES WITH A HARD-WORKING MOM WHOSE ONLY FAMILY TIME IS SPENT BOTTLING DEER URINE, ON ABC’S “WIFE SWAP”

This week in “Lowe/Hamilton,” a self-professed “princess” mom who loves to shop and primp with her spoiled daughter swaps lives with a mom who bottles deer urine for a living with her husband and kids, on “Wife Swap,” **MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 3** (8:00-9:00 p.m., ET) on the ABC Television Network. Each week from across the country, two families with very different values are chosen to take part in a two-week long challenge. The wives from these two families exchange husbands, children and lives (but not bedrooms) to discover just what it’s like to live another woman’s life. For Ohio salon owner and mom Angie Hamilton (36), her husband, Tim (47), and daughter Chastity (14), each day is filled with manicures, pedicures, shopping and beautifying. He drives Chastity wherever she needs to go and runs non-stop for whatever they need, despite the fact that he works a fulltime job. He believes that it’s his job as a man to take the best care of the women in his life, and does it all without complaining. Tim and Angie’s lives revolve around Chastity, whom they adore so much they can’t discipline her. Chastity thinks she’s the most beautiful and popular girl in town, and if she ever forgot it, her parents would be sure to remind her.

Angie travels to the Pennsylvania home of the Lowe family, where Anita (43), her husband, Rick (42), and their two kids, Brandie (19) and Brandon (17), live together but never see each other. The Lowe family is all work and no play. They’re all so busy with their individual lives that the only family time they have together is spent bottling deer urine for hunters. In addition to their full-time day jobs, Rick and Anita run a demanding business bottling and selling deer pee out of their home. The business is so hectic that the kids have to bottle and label alongside their parents, leaving little time for anything else. Anita caters to her husband at the expense of her own free time, waking up at 2:30 a.m. just to lay out his clothes, make his lunch and heat up his car. She cares little for fashion or appearance, and doesn’t mind the smell that results from bottling deer pee in her own house. Rick is obsessed with deer – he hunts them, he keeps them in a pen in his backyard, and he sells their urine to fellow hunters. The only time Brandon gets to spend with his Dad is on sporadic hunting trips. Brandie describes herself as a tomboy, and can’t remember the last time she had girl time with her mom.

In the first week of the swap, Angie works Anita’s grueling shifts of bottling deer urine and becomes overwhelmed by the smell of pee and deer meat in the Lowe household. At the Hamilton house, Anita can’t believe how Tim and Angie spoil Chastity, whose diva behavior causes Anita to break down in tears.

In the second week of the swap, when the wives change the rules and turn the tables, Angie bans everything “deer” and forces Rick to do all the chores around the house and spend time with his kids. She dotes on Brandie, spending girl time with her and making her feel beautiful and special. In the

Hamilton household, Anita and Chastity come to blows when Anita takes away Chastity's makeup and forces her to bottle deer urine, cook and do laundry in an attempt to make her appreciate the hard work Tim does. Anita gives Tim more time and freedom to do what he enjoys, but he has a hard time enjoying himself while watching Chastity buck against the new rules. He and Anita end up having it out over Chastity's bad attitude.

At the end of the swap, when the couples are reunited, will Angie learn to appreciate Tim and take her daughter to task for being bratty? Will Anita learn there's more to life than just bottling deer urine and start spending quality time with her kids?

"i-CAUGHT:" DISSECTING THE NEW VIDEO REVOLUTION

Airs Tuesday, August 21 at 9:00 p.m., ET on ABC

From posting potentially dangerous stunts online for cash to policing the police, this week's "i-CAUGHT" examines seven stories that are part of the video revolution. Anchored by Bill Weir, "i-CAUGHT," the new ABC newsmagazine, airs **TUESDAY, AUGUST 21** (9:00-10:00 p.m., ET) on the ABC Television Network. Reports include:

* **Phrogging:** Talk about a homeowner's nightmare – two women posting their how-to guide on sneaking into your suburban home. The girls' online confessions attempt to give a detailed account on how to successfully but illegally squat in a home that is already occupied for days at a time. They call themselves "phroggs" because, they say, like frogs, they leap from "pad to pad". But are these girls for real? Bill Weir reports.

* **Vidmax Kids:** Since the premiere of the TV show "Jackass," kids have been imitating it by doing – and filming – their own amateur stunts. The stunts have ramped up to self-mutilation, from kids sewing their lips shut to drilling screws into each other's arms. Thousands of these amateur stunt films grace video sharing sites. Up until recently, these daredevils just filmed their stunts and shared them for possible notoriety and respect from their peers. But now the daredevils can also make money, as web entrepreneurs like Eric Barath from Vidmax.com are actually paying for their stunt videos. Although some of the young daredevils like this new development, some parents are outraged about these sites, which they say encourage other kids to try dangerous stunts. Jim Avila reports.

* **Internet Made Me Famous:** William Sledd was just a 23-year-old living with his parents in Paducah, Kentucky and working at the Gap. Through boredom and curiosity, he started making video blogs and posting them on YouTube. He named his video sessions "Ask a Gay Man" and discussed everything from fashion and baking cupcakes to being gay in a small town. Within a few months, Sledd had the fifth-most-viewed video on YouTube. Now, almost a year later and 45 videos down, his fan base keeps growing and the mainstream media is knocking on his door.

* **Bandit Nicknames:** Bank robber surveillance video is all over the net – so are bank robber nicknames. But nicknames are in effect a marketing campaign. Meet an FBI agent whose goal is to eliminate bank robberies. Why are so many banks such easy targets? "i-CAUGHT" shows you what bank robbers already know. Bill Weir reports.

* **Jimmy Justice:** Policing the police... a one-man crusade against cops behaving badly. His weapon – a video camera. Jeff Rossen reports.

* **News Bloopers:** They are the scenes many reporters would like to forget, but will never live down: news bloopers in live shots, unexpected surprises on-air and Freudian slips. But the viral spread of information has turned these humorous and embarrassing on-air moments into new form of accountability. These moments live on the Internet forever and remind and reinforce the media how a few seconds on-air can have everlasting consequences. Jake Tapper reports.

* **One World:** One World is the story of the video most responded to on YouTube. The viral video campaign invites viewers to take a stand, join in and be a part of something. Bill Weir reports.

In conjunction with the new show, the "i-CAUGHT" website allows people to submit their own video to be considered for the program. People can upload video to it through ABCNews.com.

**DID JEALOUSY DRIVE A MILITARY MAN TO MURDER?,
ON "PRIMETIME: CRIME," TUESDAY, AUGUST 21**

And: Trust Your Instincts – A Woman Catches an Intruder in Her Home

This week "Primetime: Crime" reports the story of three young lovers caught up in a love triangle that ends with the suspicious suicide of a man named David Heinrich. But why would a young man, in love and just beginning his life, suddenly end it all? **Cynthia McFadden** reports on "Primetime: Crime," **TUESDAY, AUGUST 21** (10:00-11:00 p.m., ET) on the ABC Television Network. Please note, this series will now air at 10:00 p.m., ET.

Just after midnight on October 2, 2005, Christina Cleland came home to find her boyfriend, David Heinrich, dead. His body was on a futon, a noose wrapped around his neck. "I turn the light on," Christina tells McFadden, "and that's when I see the ropes. And I, for a whole second, I stood there because my eyes were lying to me and I didn't want to believe it." She found a typewritten suicide note. "Dear Christina," it read, "I don't love you... you need to go back to your husband." But Christina could not believe Heinrich took his own life, and suspicions were immediately raised as to whether it was a suicide or a murder.

Christina was in a complicated love triangle with Heinrich and her estranged husband, Shaun Cleland. Two years earlier, Christina and Shaun had married in Hawaii, where Shaun, a young soldier, was stationed. Soon after they married, Shaun's career in the military became the source of growing tension between the couple and resulted in the two living in different states, their marriage falling apart. After suspecting that Shaun might be cheating on her, Christina began her own relationship with the couple's former neighbor, David Heinrich. Shaun tried to stay in touch with Christina, but she was ready to move on. Shaun, however, was not ready, and he began a battle to win Christina back that culminated in Shaun going AWOL from his base in Hawaii to fly to Cleveland and beg her to come back to him. He arrived the day before Heinrich's death. And when Christina saw the knot around Heinrich's neck, she immediately recognized it. "There's a special knot on the rope that he always used to close his laundry bag so people wouldn't steal his clothes. And I knew when I saw that, that it was him," Christina tells "Primetime." But did Shaun really murder Heinrich? The program unravels the real story behind David's death.

Also: Twenty-four-year-old Nicole Bishop was living alone in a gated community patrolled by security guards, and thought she was safe – until she started coming home and noticing that things in her apartment weren't quite as she'd left them. Was there an intruder? She decided to turn her intuition into proof by setting up a hidden camera. Although it looked just like an ordinary alarm clock, it recorded some unexpected footage – a man she didn't know, letting himself into her home, trying on her lingerie and pleasuring himself sexually. The culprit turned out to be 38-year-old Shawn Rogers, who lived nearby. He was a business consultant, married, the father of a toddler, and he had a clean record – until he went to trial, that is. **Mary Fulginiti** reports on what the clock camera caught and what happened to Rogers.

And: When a Kentucky school bus mysteriously crashes leaving several children severely injured, shattered families demand to know how this could have happened. "Primetime" reports on the terrifying surveillance tape which captures the actual crash, and it will raise even more questions. Who was this bus driver and why were none of the young students wearing seatbelts? **David Muir** goes behind the scenes and to get the answers.
